

## WHERE WE ARE

Ours is a spectacular location on the sea-shore at the mouth of the Shieldaig river approximately a mile from Shieldaig.

We look north over Loch Torridon to the village of Shieldaig and Shieldaig Island and, to the east, the wooded slopes of Ben Shieldaig form a dramatic backdrop to the house and two cottages.

The giants of Torridon, all over 3000ft, *Beinn Alligin*, *Beinn Eighe* and *Liathach*, are only a short drive away.

### GETTING HERE

Torridon is a remote area by European standards and travel arrangements need some care. The map above gives a general indication of our location. For those using Sat Nav with our postcode you are given three possible locations – choose Kinloch House. From the direction of Shieldaig we are 400m beyond the entrance to the Marine Scotland field station.

Alternatively we can arrange to meet the train at Strathcarron which connects with the main line rail services into Inverness. Inverness also has a coach station and an airport which is situated a few miles to the east of the city.

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

## Relaxation

We offer you the independence of your own cottage with breakfast served in our house next door. Accommodation in the two cottages is suitable for up to eight people and we are open throughout the year.

Facilities are ideal for those with an interest in wildlife and outdoor activities and for families with children. Well-behaved dogs are welcome and there are plenty of safe areas for them to run around.



## Wildlife

### FACILITIES

We have two traditionally-built cottages which are warm and comfortable with hot water provided by solar power.

The larger cottage which sleeps four downstairs and two upstairs is about 50m from the main house. It divides into two units with a communal front door. Downstairs are two twin-bedded rooms, a bathroom and a separate toilet. The sitting room has a wood-burning stove and a small kitchen area for guests who prefer to do their own evening meals. There is a washing machine, a drying cupboard and lots of storage space. Upstairs there is a double bedroom with an en-suite shower room. This is our single-occupancy room when required.

The smaller cottage which sleeps two to four people is immediately adjacent to the main house and has proved popular with smaller families and couples. The small bedroom has twin beds. The attic, which is accessed by a ship's ladder, has a play/sleeping area for children. In the sitting room is a convertible sofa/double bed and a wood-burning stove. There is a shower room, drying cupboard and washing machine. There are tea/coffee making facilities, two electric hobs, a microwave and a fridge in the sitting room.

The house has a pool table, a well-stocked library of travel books, lots of board games for wet days and a separate building for table tennis and table football.

### BREAKFAST

We provide cooked breakfasts and packed lunches and we use local produce wherever possible. Timings are kept flexible to fit in with guests' plans for the day.

### ACTIVITIES

We have canoes and a rowing boat which guests can take along the seashore to look for seals, otters and a wide variety of seabirds. There is a rowing boat available for brown trout fishing on Loch Doughaill and also fishing on the hill lochans on the estate.

## Adventure



Part of the estate is a fenced area of over a thousand acres of regenerating native woodland where we have laid out several walks. The estate is owned and managed by the Kinloch Woodlands SCIO. Over the last 25 years half a million trees have been planted including Caledonian pine, birch, rowan, alder and oak. As the woodland matures birds and other wildlife are making it their home.

There is a good chance of seeing birds of prey including white-tailed and golden eagles, buzzards, merlins, and peregrines. There are also recently introduced red squirrels nearby.
